ATTENDANCE

One day of summer school is equivalent to approximately two weeks of regular school. Therefore good attendance is essential for GradPoint success.

1. TWO (2) absences are allowed for all courses. Upon the third absence, the student will be dropped from the course with a grade of "F" and no credit will be earned.
2. Please notify the Summer School Coordinator when your child is absent. The office will make every effort to contact parents each time a student is absent. Please make sure that you closely monitor your child's attendance.
3. Summer School begins promptly at 8:00 am/12:00 pm.
 - Students must be on time at the beginning of class and at the end of each break. The tardy policy is stated below.
 - The school day for **GradPoint** classes is 3 hours in length.
 - AM session begins at 8:00 am and ends at 11:00 am.
 - PM session begins at 12:00 pm and ends at 3:00 pm.

- GradPoint students arriving after 9:30 am or 1:30 pm will be counted absent for the entire day.
- GradPoint students arriving between 8:45-9:29 a.m. (AM session) or 12:15-1:29 pm (PM session) will be counted absent for ½ day.
- Students arriving between 8:01- 8:15 (AM session) or 12:01 – 12:15 (PM session) will be given a tardy. **THREE (3) tardies will be counted as ONE (1) absence.** This absence will count toward the two-absence limit.

CONDUCT

Students are expected to adhere to The Code of Student Conduct of the Wake County Public School System. Students are reminded of the following policies and guidelines:

1. Vandalism or abuse of school property will result in suspension and repayment for damages.
2. Loss of books and/or damage to property must be paid before grades will be issued.
3. Students referred to the Summer School Coordinator for disciplinary action may be suspended or may be required to spend time after school the following day.
4. Major infractions, as determined by the Coordinator, will result in expulsion from the Summer School program.
5. Students may not smoke or use tobacco products on school property, including the parking lot.
6. Only students enrolled in Summer School will be permitted on school campus. All other persons are subject to trespassing charges.
7. Food is not allowed in the work area.
8. Electronic devices should not interfere with your Summer School curriculum and may be kept in the office if it becomes a distraction.
