Letters of Recommendation
Guidelines for Students

1. Many colleges, scholarship programs, and employers will request a letter of recommendation.

2. Colleges are looking for **personal insights** about the student applicants, not a reiteration of grades and test scores. The most effective letters are usually obtained from individuals who know the student very well.

3. The most competitive colleges usually prefer letters from teachers of core academic courses (e.g., English, science, advanced math, social studies, and world language). These faculty members have witnessed and can write about your strengths in the classroom. **Colleges often prefer for the teacher to have taught the student during his/her junior year.**

4. **When requesting a letter of recommendation, allow the teacher or counselor a minimum of ten (10) school days for completion.** If the letter is to be mailed directly to the college or is on a specific admissions form, give the form and a stamped, addressed envelope to the teacher to mail directly. Be sure to complete the entire student section by typing or printing neatly in black ink.

5. **Make personal contact with the teacher or counselor.** DO NOT ASSUME the letter will be completed if you send a request by e-mail. Let the teacher or counselor know if they will be emailed an online recommendation form to complete.

6. **For counselor recommendations, we require a copy of your recommendation checklist, student info sheet, and resume.** You can also submit the parent response form if desired. With this information, we can write a thorough recommendation. Ask your teacher recommender if he/she would like a copy as well.

7. **Make sure your recommender is aware of any deadlines** regarding the recommendation. It's okay to follow up to make sure that the recommendation has been submitted.

8. Write a short "thank-you" note to the individual who has taken the time to support you in this way. You never know when you may need to ask this person for further assistance in the application process!!!
